- No Lifeguard on Duty
- Swim at Your Own Risk
- No Children Permitted Without Supervision.
- No Glass Allowed in Pool Area
- No Pets Allowed in Pool Area

If you are the last to leave the pool area, please close all umbrellas.

Additional Safety Tips:

- 1) Chlorine Level: the pool committee monitors the chlorine level every day and reports back to Splash Pools if the level is low. If the level is low and Splash Pools is unable to correct the problem in a timely manner, then the pool will be closed for sanitary reasons.
- 2) Glass Containers: the pool committee is in the process of obtaining a "No Glass" sign to post at the pool. If broken glass were to get into the pool, it would need to be drained, etc. This could be very costly for the homeowners.
- 3) Poop: should a child have an accident in the pool, we would need to notify Splash Pools immediately as well as close the pool immediately. Splash would then overload the pool with chlorine and then wait until the chlorine level was back down to a safe level prior to reopening. This could take several days to a week.
- 4) Snakes and the plastic returns around pool area: Splash Pools mentioned it is very possible and happens often where water moccasins, copperheads, etc. can get "stuck" in these returns. The returns are very enticing for the kids to constantly pick up and put back on. Obviously if a snake is in the return it would lash out as soon as the plastic lid was removed.
- 5) Safety Equipment: The flotation device, mounted on the south wall is not a toy and should be used only when there is an emergency.
